Each year, about half of the RPL Board position appointments expire and re-appointments or new appointments are made by City Council. The term for citizen appointments to the RPL Board is two years and the appointments for 2014-15 have all been finalized. This year, three positions were available and Renu Kapoor and Jerven Weekes will continue as RPL Board members. Joining the RPL Board for the first time is Sean Quinlan.

He has served as Executive Director of the Regina Chamber of Commerce, Director of Marketing and Organization for the Saskatchewan Roughrider Football Club, and Director of Communications for the Government of Saskatchewan. He is a member of the Board of Directors for the Regina Qu'Appelle Health Region and has served as Chairperson of the Employment Insurance Board of Referees for Saskatchewan 2008-2013.

The Regina Public Library bids a fond farewell to Elaine Kivisto who has served on the Board for the past twelve years. Elaine has been a strong advocate for public library services and her service on behalf of the citizens of Regina is deeply appreciated.

Glen Elm Branch

The Glen Elm Branch will celebrate its 35th Anniversary in March and will also transition to a new floor plan and shelving. To accommodate the changes being made within the Branch, it will be closed on Tuesday, 18 March. 4.0 Library Director's Report

Aboriginal Library Services Report Summary

Included in the Board package for information is a summary report for the 2013 provincial grant for Aboriginal Library Services. While it is important to note that the activities outlined in the report and carried out by RPL in this area exceed the value of the grant provided, it is also worth noting that it is not a comprehensive report on all activities undertaken in support of library services to Aboriginal peoples. A key example is the work done for the replacement of the Albert Branch through development of the North Central Shared Facility project. Recognizing the significant Aboriginal population in the area and involving community stakeholders and elders has been its strength.

2014 Mill Rate Request
